- Direct Communication: Email coaches directly rather than relying on agents. Personal communication can be more effective.

A coach will get multiple emails in a day or week from that same agency rep. Slowly becoming more and more desensitized and non-responsive. Coaches know the agent is selling anyone that comes their way in order to make a commission.

Families are intimidated by the idea of emailing coaches themselves, but the truth is no one is better at selling your kid than you. They are your only focus, whereas an agent divides their attention across everyone they represent. When that coach gets your email, it will be a unique touch point. You start to build a connection and bond directly. Keep them informed of your progress and as soon as you reach the performance levels they are looking for offers will come pouring in.
